6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments including whether the rule implements a state statute for the first time:

The former Chapter Inst 600 on manufactured housing installation standards expired 4/14/2022. In another rulemaking proceeding the Installation Standards Board (Board) will divide the previous Chapter Inst 500 on inspections of manufactured housing, which had also expired, into Chapter Inst 500 and Chapter Inst 600 in another rulemaking proceeding, in order to comply with Chapter 4, Part 1, 1.8 of the *Drafting and Procedure Manual for Administrative Rules*. The Installation Standards Board (Board) is adopting the Chapter Inst 600 again, renumbered as Chapter Inst 700, and with and without additional changes from the expired rules as described below:

- Inst 701, previously Inst 601, provides the purpose and scope for the chapter and is being adopted with on editorial change;
- Inst 702, previously Inst 602, provides definitions and is being adopted with no changes;
- Inst 703, previously Inst 603, describes installation standards including filing of the installation manual with the Board, site preparation systems, design requirements including load-bearing capacity, clearance under the house, design procedures for concrete block piers, footings, foundations, anchoring, and utility connection and testing. This part is being modified to change "may" to "shall" in Inst 703.03(g) on design requirements for piers less than 36 inches high and Inst 703.04(b) on hardwood shims used to close gaps and level the hours, and add the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification for submission of the installation manual.

Other proposed change are intended to improve program integrity, efficiency, and to align with current practices.

The groups affected are licensed manufactured home installers and anyone who is having a manufactured home installed.
