7. Laws:

- a. SB 334 – relative to temporary licensure for occupations and professions for persons from other states. **Majority Committee Report amendment that refers to all Ought to Pass. Minority Committee Report amendment referring to only the allied health portion Ought to Pass.**
- b. SB 531 – relative to the office of professional licensure and certification. **House Committee Report Ought to Pass with Amendment.**
- c. HB 1310 – establishing a committee to study all non-regulatory boards and commissions. **Senate Committee Report Inexpedient to Legislate.**
