ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY:

- () \$300.00 examination/license fee, made payable to: “**Treasurer, State of New Hampshire**”
- () An original recent photograph of applicant
- () A photocopy of Chiropractic Diploma
- () Two reference letters from practicing Doctors of Chiropractic (form found on website)
- () Official academic transcripts for each post secondary institution attended
- () Official academic transcripts from Chiropractic College
- () Photocopies of any current licenses, certifications or other documents that specify applicants' credentials to practice chiropractic in that jurisdiction
- () Official scores from the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners:
Parts I, II and III for applicants who graduated after January 1, 1990; or
- () Official scores from the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners:
Parts I, II, III and IV for applicants who graduated after January 1, 1996
- () Current resume (C.V.)

When your application file is complete, the jurisprudence examination will be mailed to you for completion and you will be required to return it to the Board within 20 days from the date it was originally mailed to you. An applicant cannot practice chiropractic in New Hampshire until the Board has issued a license to practice.
