**ADMINISTRATIVE**

1. The Board opened the meeting for public comment at 1:04 pm. Mike Younis, Executive Director of Options addressed the Board on HB 334 and various scopes of practice. Public comment period closed at 1:20 pm.
2. The Board's focus for the May meeting will be held specifically to gather information from CCI "Cardiovascular Credentialing International" for individuals who work in Electro Physiologic and Catheterization Laboratories. Members of this community will be invited to provide information and aide in the discussion of licensing for these individuals.
3. Rules:
  - a. Mirt 100 – Submitted to Legislative Budget Assistant. Waiting for Fiscal Impact Statement.
  - b. Mirt 200 – Submitted to Legislative Budget Assistant. Waiting for Fiscal Impact Statement
  - c. Board work on drafting rules for sections Mirt 300 and Mirt 500 with Attorney Robert Lombardi. In order to keep the processing moving forward the Board voted on a moton from Richard Serino with a second by Winslow Whitten to have Board members work on their specific sections directly with Attorney Lombardi so that more substantive drafts can be reviewed by the Board at each meeting.

Laws:

- a. HB 184 – Amended Title: relative to the license requirement for medical imaging and radiation therapy and relative to registration by practitioners with the board of medical imaging and radiation therapy. The bill extends the requirement for licensure and registration from 7/1/17 to 7/31/18. Enrolled in both the House and Senate.
- b. HB 334– relative to an exemption from licensure by the board of medical imaging and radiation therapy. This bill has been changed to allow other professionals to perform medical imaging so long as it is within their scope of practice. Introduced to the Senate on 3/9/17.
- c. HB 322 – adding rulemaking authority to require completion of a certain survey as part of the license renewal process for health care providers. Introduced to the Senate.
- d. HB 538 requiring temporary licensure of a person holding an occupational or professional license granted in another state or country. This bill has been changed to require occupational regulatory boards and commissions to post reciprocity information on their web sites. Senate Committee report “Inexpedient to Legislate”.

ADJOURN: on motion by Richard Serino with a second by David Hou, the motion to adjourn at 3:12 P.M. carried in the affirmative.
