ADMINISTRATIVE

1. Rules:

The Board worked with Attorney Robert Lombardi to review comments from both the public and the Attorneys at the Joint Legislative Committee on Administrative Rules. The following items will be discussed and voted on at the May Board meeting:

- a. A requirement for a radiation safety training course to be completed by RCES and RCIS initial applicants before being granted a licensure.
- b. Whether or not initial applicants will need to produce one of the following documents for initial licensure:
 - 1) Transcripts directly from the educational institution;
 - 2) A copy of a graduation certificate issued by the educational institution; or
 - 3) A copy of the current National Certification Card.
- c. What the passing score for Limited X-Ray machine operators should be for the national exam.

Winslow Whitten will be checking all sites to ensure that the codes of ethics are available for all professions. He will also be reaching out to those that are not to see if they can be placed on the public pages of their web site. Winslow Whitten will report his findings and any issues to the Board at the May meeting. Brandy Cusson will be asked to research and present her findings on what the appropriate passing score should be for the Limited X-Ray machine operators.

2. Laws: The Board reviewed the following bills and where they are in the legislative process:
 - a. SB 334 – relative to temporary licensure of allied health professionals from nearby states. **Houser Executive Session 4/24/18 – Voted Ought to Pass With Amendment**
 - b. SB 531 – relative to the office of professional licensure and certification. **House Executive session 4/18/18 – Voted Ought to Pass With Amendment.**
 - c. HB 1310 – establishing a committee to study all non-regulatory boards and commissions, and establishing an occupational regulation review study committee. **Senate Hearing on proposed amendment held 4/18/18**
 - d. HB 1685 – establishing a statutory commission for oversight over occupational regulation. **Killed**
3. The Board will begin the May meeting at 9 am if the Board Chair is able to attend.

ADJOURN: on motion by Todd Bedard with a second by Winslow Whitten, the motion to adjourn at 3:21 P.M. carried in the affirmative.
