2) <i>All foreign educated nurses must provide evidence of educational credentials from an organization recognized by National Council State Board of Nursing, which includes a certificate of a passing grade from an examination pursuant to Nur 302.(c). For applicant's whose program was not in English or English is not the applicant's native language, the credentialing shall also include an English proficiency exam that includes the components of reading, speaking, writing and listening pursuant to enhanced Nurse License Compact Statute Article IIIc3.
