

Frequently Asked Questions Regarding the NH PIC Exam

1. What do I need to qualify to take the exam?

To qualify to sit for the PIC exam, you must have worked as a pharmacist (in any U.S. state) for a minimum of 2 years post-graduation and currently hold a NH pharmacist license which is active and in good standing.

2. How far in advance do I need to schedule the exam?

A minimum of 2 weeks.

3. What should I bring to my exam appointment?

A valid/current government-issued photo ID and a pen or pencil.

4. Is there a fee to take the exam?

No, the exam is free of charge.

5. How many questions are there on the exam?

There are 50 multiple choice questions on this paper exam.

6. What score do I need to pass the exam?

A minimum score of 80% is required to pass.

7. How soon can I retake the exam if I fail it?

1 week or 5-business days.

8. Do I need to notify the Board of my passing the PIC exam?

No, the inspector will notify the Board's Licensing Department of your passing the exam.

9. Once I have passed the exam, do I need to retake the exam after a certain time period passes or on a regular basis?

No, according to the Board's current rules, you only need to take/pass the PIC exam once.
