The Board of Mental Health Practice is proposing to readopt with amendment Mhp 305.02 courses required for mental health counselors, adopt rules for licensure of social workers and social work associates, and adopt rules for conditional licensure for all license types, as follows:

- Mhp 305.02 describes courses required to become licensed as a mental health counselor and is being readopted with amendment to ensure that the education is evenly spread across the 11 areas of education;
- Mhp 307 is being adopted to describe the requirements to become licensed as a social worker including education, supervised work experience, and examination;
- Mhp 308 is being adopted to describe the requirements to become licensed as a social work associate including education, supervised work experience, and examination;
- Mhp 309 is being adopted to allow the issuance of conditional licenses to clinical social workers, school social workers, social workers, social work associates, clinical mental health counselors, and marriage and family therapist including how to apply for a license, fees, and duration of the conditional license.

These rules affect licensed mental health counselors, those individuals wishing to be licensed as social worker or social work associate, and those seeking conditional licensure as a clinical social worker, school social worker, social worker, social work associate, clinical mental health counselor, or marriage and family therapist.
