6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments including whether the rule implements a state statute for the first time:

The Executive Director of the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) is proposing to adopt rules as Chapter Plc 400 to establish the procedures for conducting inspections that are routine or that are conducted in conjunction with license applications. The rules include provisions applicable to all inspections as well as provisions that apply to routine inspections and provisions that apply to inspections conducted in conjunction with initial license applications.

The proposed rules do not apply to investigations, as they are covered in Plc 200 on practice and procedure. Rules that apply to inspections conducted in conjunction with renewal license applications are being developed and are expected to be proposed together with changes to Plc 300, on licensure of regulated professions, relative to such inspections in the near future.

The proposed rules will affect any licensee who has an established office or other place of business that is subject to profession-specific requirements.
