The Executive Director of the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) is proposing to adopt rules to govern the Professionals' Health Program (PHP) authorized by RSA 310:5, III and RSA 310:6, IV. The proposed rules are designed to provide a uniform framework for the PHP, and are organized in the following parts:

PART Plc 501 PURPOSE AND APPLICABILITY

PART Plc 502 DEFINITIONS

PART Plc 503 APPROVAL OF PROVIDERS; APPLICABLE STANDARDS

PART PIC 504 IMPLEMENTATION OF PROFESSIONALS' HEALTH PROGRAM

The proposed rules establish criteria and procedures for approving providers of services under the PHP umbrella and standards for approved providers, program agreements, treatment and monitoring plans, and participation.

Brief description of the groups affected: 6. (b)

> The rules will directly affect any organization that wishes to be approved as a provider under the PHP. The rules will indirectly affect any individual who is licensed in a profession that is covered by the PHP. Professions currently covered are those regulated by the Board of Licensing for Alcohol and Other Drug Use Professionals, the Board of Chiropractic Examiners, the Board of Dental Examiners, the Board of Licensed Dietitians, the Board of Medicine, the Board of Mental Health Practice, the Midwifery Council, the Board of Nursing, the Board of Registration in Optometry, the Pharmacy Board, the Board of Podiatry, the Board of Psychologists, and the Board of Veterinary Medicine.
