An explanation of the nature of (a) the imminent peril to public health or safety, demonstrating that the emergency rule is necessary to prevent the imminent peril, or (b) the substantial fiscal harm to the state or its citizens which could otherwise occur if the rule were not adopted as an emergency rule.

Nuh 401.01 establishes the continuing education requirements that must be demonstrated by nursing home administrators to obtain license renewal. Applicants must complete 40 clock hours of continuing education.

The COVID-19 pandemic necessarily caused cancellation of continuing education programs. The State of Emergency ended on June 12, 2021; however, continuing education programs remain largely unavailable.

Without the enactment of this emergency rule, nursing home administrators for whom renewal is due within the next six months will be unable to obtain sufficient clock hours of continuing education to qualify for renewal. This will result in a large proportion of nursing home administrators no longer being able to perform their essential roles, creating an immediate peril to public health and safety.

9. A summary of the effect if the rule were not adopted.

There already exists a shortage of nursing home administrators in New Hampshire due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As indicated above, if this emergency rule was not adopted, numerous nursing homes would no longer have practicing administrators.

10. A description of those affected.

The rule affects nursing home administrators, as well as their staff, patients, and the families of patients.

CHAPTER Nuh 400 CONTINUED STATUS

PART Nuh 401 REGISTRATION AND RENEWAL

Amend Nuh 401.01(b), effective 07/15/2021 (Document #2021-NHA-001), cited and to read as follows:

Nuh 401.01 Renewal of Registration

(b) Such renewal application shall consist of:

(2) Attested documentation of the completion of a minimum of ~~400~~ 4020 clock hours of continuing education in subjects related to nursing home administration in the 2 years which immediately precede the application for renewal of license;
