**QUALIFICATION AND LICENSURE**

1. **RESPIRATORY CARE PRACTITIONER APPLICATION FOR LICENSURE**

The Board reviewed the application request for initial licensure from Donald A. Tacewicz, RCP. It was noted that Mr. Tacewicz has been out of the practice since March of 2018. The Board voted on a motion from Sarah Stone with a second by Jeffrey Reisert to issue a Conditional license for supervised practice in accordance with Resp 305.

3. "State Occupational Licensing Review and Reform"; The Chair of each Board referred to in the grant will be meeting with clear in a few weeks.

4. Rules:

- a. Resp 100 and Resp 200 hearing is scheduled for February
- b. Resp 300 hearing is scheduled for February
- c. The Board reviewed the changes that were made to Resp 400. A final draft will be brought back to the Board in February to determine if it is ready to begin the rule making process.

Laws:

- a. RSA 328-F:18 – Allied Health Professionals – adding athletic trainers and genetic counselors to temporary licensure and allowing for an exemption when part of a compact. **Sponsor Representative Schmidt**
  - b. RSA 328:18-a Allied Health Professionals – removing conditional licensure while waiting for a background check. **Sponsor Representative Schmidt**
  - c. RSA 328-F:19 – Allied Health Professionals – changing the renewal date to two years from the date of licensure. **Sponsor Representative Schmidt**
5. The Board reviewed an e-mail submitted by Kiley Shacket, RCP is asking if IV insertion was still part of a NH practitioners scope of practice? The Board voted on a motion from Jeffrey Reisert with a second by Sarah Stone to respond that it is so long as the licensed individual has been trained and can demonstrate competency. The respiratory care practitioner must practice as stated in RSA 326-E:1, X, specifically “Respiratory care is given in accordance with the prescription of a physician, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant.”

ADJOURN: on motion by Jeffrey Reisert with a second by Sarah Stone, the motion to adjourn at 10:23 A.M. carried in the affirmative.
