



Update - Changes to Gas Fitter Licenses

Dear Licensee,

We are reaching out to inform you of important changes to the gas fitter licensing system. In the past, there was a single, broad "Gas Fitter" license. However, to address concerns about the need for clearer distinctions and specialized qualifications, the licensing system has been updated to better reflect the specific types of work performed by gas fitters.

Licensees not in Renewal:

- We have already begun converting licenses to their correct types. **No action is required on your part.** Our conversion process begins with licenses expiring in 2026.
- Once your license has been updated, the new license will be emailed to you by nh.licenses@doit.nh.gov. This is an unregulated inbox, please do not email or reply. Check your spam, as some emails may land there.
- Your license number will not change.

Licensees in Renewal:

- You will renew as you have in the past.
- The "upgrade" system has been discontinued. License types and specialties are now defined at issuance, and any additional qualifications must be obtained by applying for a separate license or specialty.
- Your license number will not change.
